### **Article-Clearing Away a Christmas Myth**

Jesus was born in Bethlehem, but where? In a "stable," right? No.

The Bible declares to us "there was no room for them in the inn" (Luke 2:7). It says nothing about a stable or barn; or even an innkeeper. Thus the erroneous assumption is made that Jesus ended up being born in a wood stable.

Where this idea came from is a mystery, but it has certainly become the belief in the West as seen in Christmas carols, cards, and decorations.

That Jesus would be born in Bethlehem Ephrathah (Micah 5:2), the City of David, is a settled fact.

The fields around Bethlehem (Shepherds Fields) have many caves. Indeed the flocks which pastured there were destined for Temple-sacrifices and accordingly the shepherds who watched over them were not ordinary shepherds. The shepherds would have been Levitical shepherds responsible for caring for the sheep destined for sacrifices during Passover and other Feasts to the Lord.

The caves, necessarily ritually purified, were used for shelter as needed and especially for the birthing of lambs. A little lamb is clumsy at birth. It would have been wrapped in swaddling cloths to keep it from hurting itself (Deuteronomy 17:1; Hebrews 9:14). The swaddling cloths were

repurposed old, worn-out, priest garments which cannot be thrown away.

Note: how did the shepherds know where to go; the angel didn't say? Remember in Luke 2 an angel appeared and told the shepherds, "... unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the LORD. And this will be a sign for you: you will find a baby wrapped in swaddling cloths and lying in a manger" (Luke 2:11-12 KJV).

So too, Jesus the Lamb of God, was also wrapped in swaddling cloths and placed in the manger. Where did Mary get the cloths and how did she know she would need them? Remember Mary's cousin Elizabeth (a daughter of Aaron Luke 1:5) was married to Zechariah, a priest. Both knew Jesus was Messiah (Luke 1:39-45). It is likely Zechariah provided his worn priestly garments.

Jesus was born without and lived without sin; He offered Himself as our Passover Lamb (Hebrews 4:15). At this, His First Incarnation, Jesus was crucified and died on Passover, and was buried on the Feast of Unleavened

this are found all over Israel Bread, and rose at the Feast of First Fruits; are all Spring feasts. All the Feasts of the **LORD** are the prophetic **Feasts of the LORD**.

Doesn't it make sense then that Jesus will continue to follow this pattern. So Jesus must return at one of the Fall feasts which take place in the seventh month; Tishri on the Lunar calendar. They are the Feast of Trumpets, the Feast of Atonement, and the Feast of Tabernacles (Booths). On our Gregorian calendar Tishri falls in September/October. Something to think about... and prepare for, yes?
